- A parent whose spouse is gone away for an extended period of time (i.e.: military)
- A parent whose spouse is ill for an extended period of time
- A parent whose spouse is incarcerated
- A parent who was never married
- A woman who was the victim of rape
- A single parent who has chosen artificial insemination as a way to conceive
- Surrogacy

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The Changing Face of Oklahoma Families

It can sometimes be un-imaginable how one demographic can impact a community. Below are some single parent family statistics that may help give you a better understanding of the impact that this demographic has on our communities:

- **13.6 million** Single Parents in the United States.
- **21.2 million** Children in the United States are raised by Single Parents 28% of all children under the age of 18 live with one parent.

Employment Statistics of Single Parents

- 79% Of custodial single mothers are gainfully employed.
- 50% Work full time, year round.
- 29% Work part-time or part-year.
- 92% Of custodial single fathers are gainfully employed.
- 74% Work full time, year round.
- 18% Work part-time or part-year.
- **1 in 4** Children live in a single parent household in the United States.

Oklahoma

- **33**% Households in Oklahoma are single parents households, 72% are single mothers.
- **79,580** Oklahoma children are raised by grandparent(s).
 - **1 in 3** Children in Oklahoma live in a single parent household.

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Over the past nine years, SPSN has launched several new programs and projects in response to the needs of our state's single parent families. These programs and projects include:

Life Coaching

Life coaching is a weekly support and accountability program for single parents and their families. This program is conducted via Teleconference or live in a small group setting with a qualified or professional serving as the facilitator and life coach allowing the single parent an opportunity to learn the life skills necessary for successful parenting and living.

- Consumer to Creator series

Support groups

Our monthly support groups are facilitated by professionals and interns in the field of behavioral sciences. Group sessions are held for parent children and teens by age category. The parent and child are covering the same topic on the same day and the discussions are led by the professional to get the participant to express their life issues. Children are encouraged to express their emotions by discussion, art therapy, rhythmic and movement therapy, poetry and or animal therapy. Chapter support groups are being established across the state.

Parents Night Out

This is a night set aside to give the parent and the children some respite care. Most single parents rarely get a break from the day to day routine of caring for their children and this day is designed to give the family members a "reset." This evening is set up once a month at the chapter locations across the city.

Adopt a Single Parent Family Mentoring Program

The purpose of the "adopt a single parent family" mentoring program is to provide a foundational model for mentorship, accountability, and education for the single parent family. These families in partnership with two parent families will learn how to write out a vision for their lives and walk it out over time with accountability.

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Signature Events

Queen For A Day (Founding event)

The Queen For a Day event is our largest yearly event that focuses on Single moms and their need for a day of encouragement, education, royal treatment and pampering, a break from their kids and new insight as to how to keep going in this endeavor to successfully raise their children.

Single moms carry the burden of mom and dad, breadwinner, disciplinarian, chief cook, yard and handyman, cheer leader, cheer giver, visionary, employee, homework supervisor, financial analyst, chief decision maker, protector, and the list goes on and on There was an immediate concern that single moms were either neglecting themselves or that they were neglecting their children.

Queen for a Day was launched almost a decade ago and at the first event we had about 30+ women in attendance. Our last event hosted approximately 300 women and about 300 kids.

Mother and Son Conference

The mom and sons event was designed to address the issues that single moms face in understanding males and in raising boys and also to help the boys and young men deal with issues that they are facing without the leadership of a dad in the home.

The moms learn about how to identify and understand their sons personalities and needs and how to best fill those needs and voids. They learn how the different personalities think, what their love language would be and how to lead them to success.

The boys and youth learn about leadership, responsibility and about making their siblings their best friend.

We work with the families to establish a family mission and vision, values and principles that they will live by.

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2013 At a Glance

We had an exciting year at Single Parent Support Network! In addition to our signature annual events: An Enchanted Evening, Queen for a Day, Family Day and Mother and Sons Conference, SPSN continues to have weekly support group meetings, life coaching sessions and monthly Parent Nights Out. SPSN also completed and published *WingSpan*, a collection of inspirational stories shared by single parents who overcame struggles in the face of adversity. SPSN is in the process of launching a new program called *ReStart* (Re-Supporting, Teaching and Reaching Together), a curriculum that Founder & CEO Rhonda Thomas co-authored with Monica Epperson, CEO of CEO of the Child of Divorce. The curriculum covers various aspects of self care, life skills, budgeting, anger management, effective communication, etc, with the intent of reaching out to single parents in the community through businesses, churches and schools. Here are some highlights from 2013...

239 single mothers and their 420 children attended

22 Single Mothers and 38 children attended the

Mothers & Sons Conference;

360 single parents and their 540 children attended

30 support group meetings;

32 parents and 72 children enjoyed 6 Parent's Night Out.

--- mentors who worked with --- single parents and their children,

SPSN served a total of **1,520** meals to program participants and volunteers at various events.

At SPSN, we realize that stabilizing the family is an essential component for single parent households in breaking the cycle of poverty.

- 50% of single parent families moved into improved housing;
- 20% of single parents enrolled in higher education classes;

- 99% of parents began to feel positive about their future after attending our workshops and becoming involved in our program.
